Re: Information regarding a confirmed case of COVID-19 in Year 9 at St Joseph's RC High School

Late this evening, I was notified of a confirmed case of COVID-19 in Year 9. In line with guidance and information from Welsh Government, Environmental Health and Newport City Council, pupils who have been identified as a close contact of the Year 9 pupil will need to self-isolate.

As your child was identified as a close contact, they should self-isolate up to and including Friday 18th December. Your child should not return to school until Monday 4th January 2021.

Your child must self-isolate by staying at home.

Your child should remain at home. They should not go to public areas or other people's houses, and they must not use public transport or taxis until the period of self-isolation has finished. Please minimise contact with other people in your home and do not invite people to visit your home.

You should monitor if your child has symptoms.

The symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- A new continuous cough and/or
- High temperature (37.8oC or above) and/or
- Loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell.

Whilst your child is self-isolating, if they develop symptoms, you can book a test by logging onto https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or where this is not possible, by calling 119. The test is only effective for those who are experiencing symptoms and needs to be taken in the first 5 days of having symptoms. It only checks if you have coronavirus right now and not if you have already had the virus. A negative test result does not mean you can stop self-isolating for the 14 day required period, as you have been identified as a confirmed contact through the contact tracing process.

To reduce the risk of COVID-19 spreading, there are things that everyone in your family can do to help. These include:

- washing hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- using hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- washing hands as soon as they get home
- covering their mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve (not their hands) when they cough or sneeze
- putting used tissues in the bin immediately and washing hands afterwards
