Despite the very many positive comments about the distance learning offer at St Joseph's, there were some areas for us to develop and we have already begun to act on your feedback:

You said	We did
More structure is needed for the live wellbeing sessions.	There is now a consistent structure in place for all live wellbeing session which include prayer, reflection and discussion of a PSHE topic.
More live lessons needed as they motivate the children and help to combat feelings of loneliness and isolation.	We have increased the number of live lessons scheduled when a year group has to self-isolate.
Live lessons are best when they are structured like a normal lesson and are longer sessions.	On our Inset day, this feedback was shared with staff and teachers are now encouraged to approach a live lesson in a similar way to a face to face lesson.
Connectivity caused some technical issues with the live lessons.	Our IT team has checked connectivity across the school and where the signal was a little weaker, they have added hardware to improve the quality of the connection.

We are so proud of the way your children and our teachers have worked together this term to try to keep wellbeing and learning at the heart of all we do. Your role, as parents and carers, however, cannot be underestimated. I understand how difficult it is for the entire family when a child has to self-isolate and work from home and yet your support of your children and their learning has been unwavering.

I am confident that, as we move through the next few months, and indeed, the rest of this academic year, we will all continue to learn but we will only grow if we continue to work in partnership with you.

Thank you again for all you do to support your child's education and for your support of our school.
