NHS SERVICES FOR CHILDREN ARE CHANGING

when The Grange University Hospital opens



CALL 999 OR GO TO THE GRANGE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

if your child has a LIFE-THREATENING ILLNESS or SERIOUS INJURY
(Children under 1 year will need to go to The Grange University Hospital for minor injuries).



GO TO A MINOR INJURY UNIT

at Nevill Hall, the Royal Gwent, Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr or Ysbyty Aneurin Bevan Hospitals,
if your child (age over 1 year) has minor wounds, burns or scalds / insect bites / minor limb injuries
/ minor head or face injury / minor eye injury / foreign bodies in the nose or ear.
There are x-ray facilities available for broken bones and there is the ability to suture wounds.



CONTACT YOUR GP

if your child has a high temperature, or other non-urgent illnesses or concerns.
Your GP surgery should be your first port of call for non-urgent illnesses –
they can refer your child to hospital if needed.



CALL NHS 111

if your child is unwell and you are unsure what to do
and you need help. You can also call 111 for urgent
GP care when your own Surgery is closed.



TREAT AT HOME or CONTACT YOUR PHARMACIST

if your child has a minor illness or ailment such as a
sore throat, cough, skin irritation or common mild illness.
