I am privileged to introduce this edition of Insight which allows us to share with you the success of all our pupils this summer. The school has a track record of excellent examination results over time and this is the result of consistent commitment and dedication from our students and staff.

This year at GCSE, pupils performed exceptionally well across all subjects, resulting in:

32% of all grades awarded were A*/A. Nationally 20%.

78% of all grades awarded were A*-C. Nationally 63%.

98% of all grades awarded were A*-G. Nationally 97%.

34% of our students achieved 5A*-A grades.

68% of pupils achieved a minimum of 5 A*-C grades (inc. Mathematics and English).

99% achieved a minimum of 5 A*-G grades.

74% of students were awarded an A*-C in mathematics. Nationally 49%.

80.5% of students achieved an A*-C in English. Nationally 55%.

In Year 13, pupils shared similar outstanding success with

30% of all grades achieved were A*/A.

75% of pupils achieved at least 3 A levels at A*-C.

These fantastic achievements demonstrate how hard our students have worked, how tirelessly they have pursued their dreams, and how they continue to strive with ambition for their future. We are very proud of the young people that leave St Joseph's, willing and able to serve others in a true spirit of faith and love.

The Summer Holidays were again a busy period for our amazing Site and IT teams. Here are the projects they have been working on:

Site team

- All stage electrical equipment were tested and repaired where needed. Full emergency light annual test and temperature monitoring valves annual service and lightning rod annual inspection and clean, including 5-Year statutory electrical test carried out (next one due 2030). All street lights checked with 11 new bulbs, new electric sockets fitted tech room ready for new equipment and new sockets where needed.
- All drains and fat traps jet washed and cleaned and pumping station annual service and clean. Including all bins cleaned and refreshed ready for new term and full clean of all gutters on site.
- Annual safety inspection carried out on moveable walls, issues highlighted have been rectified and repaired, roller shutter door annual inspection, repairs have been carried out and completed. All fire dampers checked and cleaned plus all fire extinguishers checked and replaced. Inspection and repairs of all external blue doors, replacing doors pins to ensure safety, all window mechanisms repaired. New emergency exit crash bar fitted in the sports hall.
- All PE equipment annual inspection, service, and repair where required, all new basketball nets erected rear playground. Full annual inspection, air handling units, including science chemical cupboards, art kiln room and tech workshops.
- Heat pump system now commissioned and running so the school no longer uses gas for heating and hot water and a full inspection and clean of all solar panels has been completed.

IT team

Device Refresh: All computers and laptops that no longer support Windows 11 have been replaced. Every device now runs Windows 11 and Office 365 with updated configurations and policies to improve performance and security.

Wireless Display Adapters: Each room is now equipped with a wireless display adapter, allowing you to mirror your laptop to the projector.

Monitor Upgrade: Outdated monitors in your classroom have been swapped out for new, high-resolution models to support all teaching needs.

IT have also conducted a comprehensive audit of all Chromebooks across the school. The results of this report will help ensure that all devices are accounted for, properly maintained, and ready for use in the new term.

Once again, the whole school community is incredibly grateful to both teams of dedicated professionals that manage site and it infrastructure, providing a safe, modern and clean environment in which to work and learn. We thank each one of them for their continued hard work and first class support.

An update from Mrs Lindsay Todd, SJHS Careers Officer

South-East Wales: Employment Opportunities and Demand Sectors

For students considering their next steps, understanding the local labour market is crucial. South-East Wales continues to experience growth in several key sectors:

- Healthcare and Social Care: with an ageing population, demand for nurses, carers, and mental health professionals remains high. NHS Wales is one of the largest employers in the region.
- Technology and Digital: Cardiff and Swansea are hubs for tech startups and digital firms, with roles in software development, cybersecurity, and data analytics seeing strong growth.
- Construction and Skilled Trades: infrastructure projects across the region have created opportunities for electricians, plumbers, and civil engineers.
- Education: schools and colleges are recruiting teachers and support staff, particularly in STEM subjects.
- Hospitality and Tourism: seasonal demand continues in coastal and rural areas, offering entry-level roles and progression opportunities.
- Green Energy and Sustainability: Wales' commitment to renewable energy is generating roles in environmental engineering and sustainability consultancy.

Linking Education to Employment

The rise in vocational and technical qualifications is encouraging, especially as they align with many of the growth sectors in SE Wales. For example, students who have completed qualifications in health and social care or digital technologies are well-positioned to enter high-demand fields.

As a Careers Adviser, my role is to help students interpret their results not just as academic achievements, but as stepping stones toward meaningful careers. Whether a student is pursuing further education, an apprenticeship, or entering the workforce directly, understanding the local labour market helps them make informed, confident decisions.

Next Steps and Support

Students unsure of their path can explore resources such as Careers Wales, Working Wales, and local FE colleges such as Coleg Gwent, St David's Catholic College and Cardiff and Vale College. These platforms offer guidance on training, apprenticeships, and job opportunities tailored to the Welsh economy.



These areas of work are important to help grow the economy and provide more jobs for the future.




