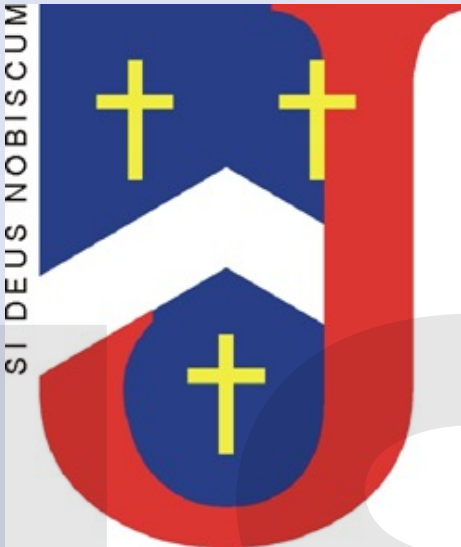

<b>Faith-filled and Hopeful</b>	<b>Faith-filled</b> in their beliefs and <b>hopeful</b> for the future.
<b>Eloquent and Truthful</b>	<b>Eloquent</b> and <b>truthful</b> in what they say of themselves, the relations between people, and the world.
<b>Learned and Wise</b>	<b>Learned</b> , finding God in all things; and <b>wise</b> in the ways they use their learning for the common good.
<b>Curious and Active</b>	<b>Curious</b> about everything; and <b>active</b> in their engagement with the world, changing what they can for the better.
<b>Intentional and Prophetic</b>	<b>Intentional</b> in the way they live and use the resources of the earth, guided by conscience; and <b>prophetic</b> in the example they set to others.
<b>Grateful and Generous</b>	<b>Grateful</b> for their own gifts, for the gift of other people, and for the blessings of each day; and <b>generous</b> with their gifts, becoming men and women for others.
<b>Attentive and Discerning</b>	<b>Attentive</b> to their experience and to their vocation; and <b>discerning</b> about the choices they make and the effects of those choices.
