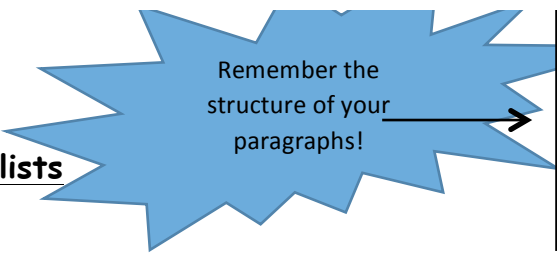

Identify - point out and name from a number of possibilities						
Define - give the precise meaning of the term.						
Assess - weigh up the importance of the point. This means there are a number of possible explanations.						
Explain - give reasons and provide an understanding of how or why.						
Outline - give a brief summary.						
Identify and explain - state briefly and develop your answer by discussing your reasons why.						
Discuss - build up an argument about a point and present more than one side of the evidence with supporting examples.						
Do you agree with this view - (15 marks) in your answer you are advised to refer to the point in the question and two other points to support your judgement.
